HOUSE WINE / DESSERT

The Ned, Noble Sauvignon Blanc
New Zealand

£4 £23

This is what happens when Sauvignon Blanc grapes are left on the vines six weeks after the grapes have been picked to make a dry Sauvignon. The "noble" rot attacks the grapes and the result is something completely magical – super intense sweetness with racing acidity and heavenly aromas.

CHAMPAGNE

Duval Leroy :
Duval Leroy Brut NV Champagne,
France £9 £50

France's favourite Champagne – there are more famous names but very, very few can match the quality of this stunning fizz. Unusually for Champagne, Carole Duval-Leroy's family owns all their own vineyards and management is strict, resulting in sensational quality.

Duval Leroy Rose NV Champagne,
France £60

A wonderful pink onion skin colour leads to explosive aromas of leafy red fruit, strawberries and delicious candy – really looks the part, but tastes utterly divine as well.

Laurent Perrier :
Laurent Perrier Brut NV Champagne,
France £60

It's delicious; green apple fruit with a toasted almond finish.

Laurent Perrier Cuvée Rose Champagne,
France £80

The best selling rose Champagne in the world !
 Fresh fruit followed on the palate by a full bodied yet elegant mouthfeel.

The House of Bollinger:
Bollinger Special Cuvee Champagne,
France £65

Bone dry, full bodied wine with the classic biscuit finesse.

Bollinger Le Grande Annee Champagne,
France £125

Powerful and elegant, chunky fruit with hints of warm buttered nuts.

HOUSE WINE / WHITE

V, Pinot Grigio *Transylvania* £4.25 £16

Wines have been cultivated in Romania since the 7th Century BC and were famous throughout the ancient world. This Pinot Grigio is full flavoured with clean citrus fruit character and hints of spice and cumin.

Mallee Point, Chardonnay *Australia* £4.25 £16

Mallee Point Chardonnay flaunts aromas of fresh tropical fruit with a touch of coconut-vanilla oak. This well structured, full flavoured wine provides hints of peach and melon while remaining silky smooth and easy to drink.

V, Riesling *Transylvania* £4.25 £16

It all sounds so weird, doesn't it? Transylvania? Riesling? But honestly, this is a breathtakingly good glugger. First of all, it's nice and dry, secondly, Riesling is the king of white grapes – intense lemon and lime aromas flood the senses and, thirdly, coming from Transylvania it has wonderful bite (groan!).

Ortonese, Malvasia *Italy* £4.25 £16

Malvasia is actually one of central Italy's most widely planted grape varieties, but is not often seen over here on wine lists. The wine has an unusual very voluptuous mouth feel and relatively low acid. Ripe tropical fruit flavours with hints of honeysuckle, delicious.

Fairhall Cliffs, Sauvignon Blanc *New Zealand* £4.75 £18

Will we ever tire of the brilliance of New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc? Well, as long as they keep producing lip-smackingly tasty mango, passionfruit, nettle and asparagus beauties like this there's no chance!

HOUSE WINE / ROSE

Agoston, Garnacha-Cabernet *Spain* £3 £15

Garnacha & Cabernet-particularly appreciated for its lively nature, delicious flavours and aromas of raspberries, strawberries, rose petals and hints of cherry.

WHITES

Santa Alicia Reserve, Chardonnay *Chile* **£18**

A complex multi-layered wine with strong hints of top-end Burgundy. Harmonious in every way with integrated white pear & melon fruit backed up with buttered toast flavours from the French oak.

Murrays Road, Sauvignon Blanc *New Zealand* **£22**

New Zealand Sauvignon Blancs have captivated wine lovers around the world with their uniquely vibrant and extraordinarily pungent character – this is one of the best you will ever try: dripping with tropical fruit flavours (passion fruit, mangoes) and gorgeous hints of capsicum, asparagus and nettles. If you haven't tried a Kiwi Sauvignon before then try this – you will be in for a serious treat!

The Ned, Pinot Gris *New Zealand* **£24**

Forget all the Italian Pinot Grigios floating about at the moment; this is one of the finest Pinot Grigios in Northern Ireland today. Made by the legendary Brent Marris it's incredibly sexy stuff – savoury, haunting aromas of nectarine are wrapped up in a deliciously silky texture and everything is in perfect harmony.

SPECIAL OCCASION WHITES

Florian Mollet, Sancerre *France* **£30**

The world's best Sauvignon Blanc is still made in the Loire as this beautiful wine illustrates. No bells and whistles, just pure lime fruit with a nice vegetal, green herb touch. As with all of the very best French wines the key words are elegance and restraint. A really lovely glass...

Bird in Hand, Riesling *New Zealand* **£31**

First things first – this stuff is bone dry and as far removed from the sweet style of German Riesling as it is possible to be. Secondly, if you continue to ignore the sheer greatness of this uber-lime scented, crushed granite and ice, fruit bomb legend then more fool you! Every lover of Sauvignon Blanc should try this – you won't be disappointed!

Valdamor, Albarino *Spain* **£31**

In the most prestigious wine competition in the world, the Decanter World Wine Awards, this wine came in the top 16 of almost 1,000 wines tasted from Spain. Albarino is unique – sensational, heady aromatics are allied to intense steeliness and nervy acidity, creating a wine of great power and class.

Marisco 'The Kings Bastard', Chardonnay *New Zealand* **£32**

The latest reincarnation of Brent Marris, the founder of Wither Hills. Brent is a fantastic winemaker and this Chardonnay is soft, fleshy and ripe with loads of appeal. Dangerously drinkable!!

HOUSE WINE / RED

Mallee Point, Merlot	Australia	£4.25	£16
<p>With a typical Merlot character we have all come to love, this wine will suit all tastes. Crushed berries and fresh spice have been seamlessly combined with soft French oak to create a wine of length and character. The palate is well structured and features full and supple tannins.</p>			
Agoston, Tempranillo-Cabernet	Spain	£4.25	£16
<p>Agoston has been named as one of Spain's best wines for its lively nature and excellent price! Gutsy, spicy Tempranillo, the great Spanish grape used in Rioja, is beefed up with a splash of dark, cassis riddled Cabernet Sauvignon. ¡Arriba! ¡Arriba!</p>			
Ortonese, Sangiovese Merlot	Italy	£4.25	£16
<p>Could this be the best value wine in Europe? Possibly! Camillo de Julius has won more awards than any other Italian winemaker by making deliciously ripe, fruit driven beauties with no oak getting in the way. Spectacularly good!</p>			
Long Neck Pinotage	South Africa	£4.25	£16
<p>South Africa's claim to fame in the wine world – Pinotage will, some day be as popular as Merlot. Concentrated fruit on the nose, pepper and a hint of figs. Full, rich, meaty palate, full of fruit, rounded & long on the finish. Ideal with a barbeque or any full-flavoured meats.</p>			
Heartland Stickleback, Shiraz Cabernet	Australia	£5	£19
<p>Ben Glatzers brainchild. This wine has is soft and spicy, displaying aromas of blackcurrants and summer berries with hints of eucalyptus and a smooth round palate. An outstanding wine of exceptional complexity and character.</p>			

REDS

Santa Alicia, Reserve Malbec *Chilie* **£18**

While the Maipo Valley is most famous for cabernet sauvignon, this malbec is a prime example of how tasty those wines can get when coming from properly ripened fruit. The wine is well-rounded, yet with quite a powerful attack of blended red and black fruit. Nicely ripe tannins come through to the finish, showing references of oak barrels, a touch of smoke and earth-driven minerality.

Heartland, Shiraz *Australia* **£18**

Aptly described by Matthew Jukes' The Wine List 2006: 'as "Muscular Little Sod" - Ben Glaetzer's entry-level Shiraz is really rocking. With serious fruit quality and enough mint, eucalyptus and smart oak to impress, you must try this wine.

Cote du Rhone Cuvee Richette, Grenache, Syrah, Mourvedre *France* **£19**

From the notorious Patrick Lesec. This wine offers attractive notes of black fruits, tar, and licorice. From a great producer in a great vintage - it's drinking as well as many Chateaufeuf du Papes at twice the price...

Earthworks, Cabernet Sauvignon *Australia* **£21**

Earthworks is made entirely from Barossa grapes from trusted family growers. This is the entry level wine of Langmeil - a winery that dry farms, basket presses and farms pretty close to organic. Every attention to detail is reflected in this stunning wine.

SPECIAL OCCASION REDS

Gigondas, Grenache/Mourvedre/Syrah **France** **£35**

"90/100. Equally strong in a more challenging vintage is the Gigondas Cuvee Romaine Les Espalines. Blue and red fruits intermixed with floral and forest floor notes are present in this medium-bodied wine. With good acidity, ripe tannin and a nicely textured mouthfeel, it can be consumed over the next 8-10 years." (The Wine Advocate)

The Ned, Pinot Noir **New Zealand** **£31**

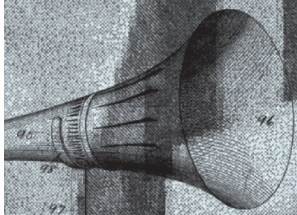
Once bitten by the Pinot Noir bug it's difficult to be quite as smitten with any other grape in quite the same way. New Zealand is now producing some of the world's finest examples of this precious wine and The Ned is right in the thick of things – dripping with raspberry truffle, meat and wild truffle aromas....wow..

Valduero, Crianza **Spain** **£37**

Bright, dark purple colour, black fruit aromas with hints of spice and balsamic notes. Rich, layered wine with ripe tannins and excellent balance. Extraordinary stuff - Ribera continues to challenge Rioja for the title of Spain's greatest wine region.

Godolphin, Shiraz Cabernet **Australia** **£50**

Ben Glatzer at his best. The Godolphin has an intriguing nose of chocolate, crushed herbs, cedar, blackberries and smoke leads into a tightly-focused palate with fine-grained tannin and incredible density. Overall, the tight, savoury Cabernet Sauvignon combines with the more generous Shiraz to give this blend great texture, structure and restraint.

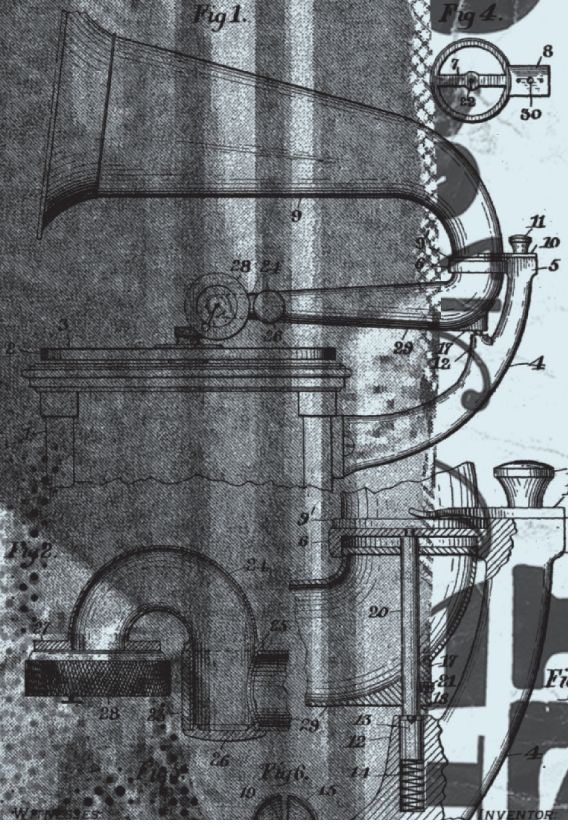
